Students who study music tend to be more self-confident and open-minded.

Students who study music tend to stay in school and not drop out. (This is a big one....)

Students who study music tend to have success in college.

Students who study music often positively affect the relationships with their families and social circles.

About 60% of HS music students prepare and participate in District Solo/Ensemble festival each year. About 40% of those students advance to State Solo/Ensemble.

Ten or more events produced by the Eureka Public Schools music program use the auditorium each year.

Eureka hosts the Northwest Montana Choral Express Festival every three years, inviting 100+ student vocalists from all high schools in Lincoln and Sanders County.
